NORWAY

For our Christian Police students, the Covid situation makes it impossible for us to meet as usual at the Police university college. Under normal conditions the police students meet every second Tuesday. This year they have been able to form a group on Facebook and fortunately are still able to gather and share in a virtual setting. I and the student board hope it will be possible to meet outside the school later this fall. The student board gathered recently to discuss how we might cope in the future. The rest of the country, besides the students are doing fine. Our colleagues in Kristiansand in the south of Norway come together every Tuesday at the police station for prayer. Other towns like Bergen and Oslo are coming together for devotion and fellowship. We want to make a specific prayer request: We were tasked to protect a strange group called SIAN (stop

islamization of Norway). Counter demonstrations were held and they wanted to beat up these protestors and the Police were called to intervene and to separate the two factions. Some officers were badly hurt and wounded, whilst they called the Police as being racist. Please pray for the public to understand the job the police have to do and for this tense situation to calm down.

GERMANY

Thank you for praying for the healing of Kyle Tromanhauser (above) as he has recently undergone hip replacement surgery. Kyle and Mathilda are serving in an international church in Munich, Germany and have been friends of our association for many years. They were instrumental in the starting and the follow up of the CPA over in Tirana Albania. He did offer a weekly bible study group for police officers. Mathilda comes from Albania while Kyle comes from USA.



Also, in northern Germany for many years we have a serving member of the CPV originally from South Africa. Willy Rabald went to Belgium to serve there after his retirement and is now involved in the area.

MOLDOVA

At the beginning of September, the CPA Moldova were able to meet near to the border of Nistria and Transnistria, which is still occupied by Russia. The photograph shows many of the on-duty and active members of our Association. We are grateful that in the last month, friends in CPV Germany, with particular help from Matthias Lehman, were generous





in supporting the CPA Moldova to equip Fire-fighters with tons of necessary supplies of clothing. Approximately 460 fireman now have suitable jackets, trousers and helmets to do their dangerous jobs. This support and effort is a great 'door-opener' for the missionary work of Anatolie Andriuti, the CPA president of Moldova. 5 tons and 460 equipped firemen with material from fire departments in two states in Germany for Moldova. The transport and coordination is done by LIO, the mission in Switzerland.
